OUR MISSION

I in 3 Texans will experience domestic violence—one of the highest rates in the country. The Family Place is one of the largest family violence service providers in Texas empowering survivors of family violence with safe housing, counseling and skills that create independence, while building community engagement and advocating for social change to stop family violence. In 2024, we provided services to 40,150 unduplicated individuals including 42,140 nights of emergency shelter, 20,805 nights of transitional housing, 4,480 hours of counseling, 6,970 hours of case management sessions and 6,601 hours of court-ordered psychoeducational groups for batterers. All services are provided in Spanish and English.

Emergency Shelter Services provides family violence survivors with safety, food, clothing, transportation, legal services, counseling and case management at Sally's House (**107** beds), Ann Moody Place (**47** beds) and our Men's Shelter (**14** beds).

Children's Education Services are provided at our Safe Campus for children in both emergency shelter and transitional housing.

DVBeds is a real-time emergency shelter bed platform that tracks shelter bed availability for participating agencies.

Domestic Violence High-Risk Program is a collaboration with the criminal justice system as part of the Dallas Domestic Violence High-Risk Team to increase victim safety and offender accountability.

8 high-risk clients accessed emergency shelter

100% of 359 survivors contacted from Dallas Police Department referrals were provided information about services and resources

Faith & Liberty's Place Family Center provides a safe, child-centered environment where trained professionals facilitate supervised child visitation and monitored exchanges with noncustodial parents. Referrals come from Dallas family courts from child custody cases where there is history of family violence.

Battering Intervention & Prevention

Program provides court-ordered psychoeducational groups for offenders that educate, challenge proabuse beliefs and provide useful information with the goal of keeping future intimate partner relationships free of violence.
